DESCRIPTION GÉNÉRALE DU COURS :

This course aims to introduce students to theoretical and methodological debates about global governance through the case of food. In the first part, it presents analytical tools to describe the global governance of food as well as the current crises it faces, from the resurgence of a global food crisis in 2008 to climate change. In the second part, the class deals with questions that emerged from this context of crisis: should this governance be more open to non-state actors (private sector, NGOs, social movements)? How could expertise help transform intergovernmental negotiations? How are agricultural world statistics and global models produced and used, and by whom? In these sessions, the case of food will be compared with other sectors, such as health and climate change. The last part deals with expertise & current controversies on world food politics: the promises & limits of biotechnologies, the financialization of farmland, food security in a time of pandemics, etc.

At the end of the course, students will get familiar with current academic debates on global governance, esp. in the case of food.
